From the Pastor's Study February 2016

January has slipped by quickly and we are already coming to the end of the first week of February, the shortest month of the year. Despite the date, I still haven't put away all of my Christmas decorations at home. I had better get busy or there will still be a snowmen and a Santa Clause on my mantle Easter morning.

Ash Wednesday is next week already, marking the beginning of the season of Lent. The florist has already given us a deadline for ordering Easter flowers. The UCC Lenten daily devotionals have arrived. The stores are already stocked with spring clothing, garden tools and seeds. I look forward to winter as a time to slow down, to go within and rest and be renewed from the business of the warmer months. Instead, I've have been shoveling snow and making plans for a new season in the church.

In February we celebrate the secular holidays of Valentine's Day and Presidents Day; while the church has Ash Wednesday and the days of Lent. I am grateful for all the special days we celebrate throughout the year both secular and religious. If it wouldn't be for those special days we set aside to honor someone or something important our lives would be a continuous, monotonous series of days, weeks, months and years. Those special days of celebration help to break the routine of our lives, to stop, reflect and hopefully rest for a while if only for a day.

Not everyone appreciates the significance of the special days of the year. Children will appreciate being off on Monday for Presidents Day although I doubt they will spend much time thinking about Lincoln or Washington. For many people Valentine's Day will just be a day to remind them of their single status.

But hopefully those of us who recognize the special religious days of February will find special meaning in them. Ash Wednesday and the forty days of Lent leading up to Easter should be significant for people of faith. Those special days invite us to slow down, reflect upon on where we are in our faith journey, in our relationship with God. Not any easy thing to do in a world that continuously demands our time and attention to non-religious matters. It does require a concerted effort on our part to slow down for the next six weeks, to change our daily habits. We can begin our Lenten journey by attending the Ash Wednesday service next week. By attending a special church service in the middle of the week we take the first step in changing our daily routine. The first words you will hear at that service will be; "We have left many important pursuits to gather here. In these moments, worship is our first importance." The decision to take that first step away from the routine of the world we live in is always the hardest but the most important decision we must make.

It is easy for us as Christians to forget who we are, and *whose* we are. By participating in the disciplines of the Lenten season we are reminded that we are mortal, that we were created by God and will one day return to God. We are reminded that life is short and uncertain, that we need a savior, and that every day you and I do or say something that separates us from God. Those are truths that are easily forgotten in a world that is focused on self and gaining personal wealth and success.

We live in a world that needs a savior. The good news is that we have a savior, Jesus. I pray that you find time each day that leads to Easter Sunday to stop if only for a moment and remember the one who lived for you, the one who died for you, and continues to be with you for eternity.

Dear Friends of St. Jude,

Happy New Year! Time is so precious to the children and families of St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, and I wanted to thank you for contributing \$4,411.67 in December 2015. You are helping provide more time for each of our St. Jude families to spend together with their children -- children like sweet Mason.

When Mason was just 4 years old, he was playing with friends when his mom noticed his coloring was off from the rest of the children. He also had some bruising on his back, but Mason was an active boy, so his mom initially thought the bruises came from rough-housing with his pals.

But his mom still felt something wasn't right, so she took him to a local clinic and hospital to run tests. And then his mom received Mason's terrifying diagnosis . . . acute lymphoblastic leukemia, a type of blood cancer.

Mason was immediately referred to St. Jude, where doctors told his mom that if he had not come to St. Jude when he had, he might have passed away in his sleep within days. Can you imagine hearing your child has days to live? Time is precious.

Mason received a two-and-a-half year treatment plan of chemotherapy, and he's ready to go fishing and play outdoors again. His mom said, "It's been an awesome place, and he loves it. A lot of times he wants to spend the night *inpatient*, because they have Wii and he loves the attention he gets. He really does love St. Jude."

Thank you so much for the compassion you have for our children, and for giving them a chance to spend precious time with their loved ones. I am truly grateful to know that we have your support in the New Year.
