2018 PASTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT

Hopefully you have noticed the **BE THE CHURCH** sign that is now hanging in our Fellowship Hall at Apostles. This sign is one of two that were posted outdoors on the property here at Apostles for several years. These signs speak volumes as to who we are as a community of God's people and what we believe we are called to be about in service and ministry in not only our church, but the community and the world beyond. It gives me great joy to know that I have found this to be the case with Church of the Apostles United Church of Christ. This congregation is truly striving to live into the message that this sign lists as what we believe we as a church community should be about.

As your Designated Pastor for a period of 2-3 years, along with Conference staff from Penn Central Conference and the leadership here at Apostles, we have set goals and used the "**BE THE CHURCH**" Mission Planning Guide to help identify where energies exist for ministry that can be built upon, then to develop specific outcomes/impacts and plans toward realizing the benefits of those outcomes, and finally to offer tools and strategies for measuring progress toward achieving the stated outcomes/impacts as a congregation.

One of those ministries that was identified and built upon was the Pollinator & Wildlife Habitat and the addition of the Monarch Waystation with official designation. This team of dedicated individuals (I will not list in fear of omitting someone), took another step in offering an educational opportunity by hosting a program on the Monarch Butterfly and gifting those who preregistered and desired a nursery with caterpillars and milk weed leaves for food to take home and observe the amazing process of the lifecycle of the Monarch Butterfly. This amazing ministry has promoted the vital practice of protecting and caring for our environment.

The Community Gardens continue to be offered to folks in the area who desire to maintain and plant their own vegetable gardens. Once again there were several gardens dedicated to growing produce for Community and Human Services here in Waynesboro. This ministry promotes our call to share earthly resources.

The Silver Express ministry continues to provide non-perishable food items, eggs, fresh fruits, sandwich meats, cheese, and bread to the folks at Trinity House, a low income housing complex in Waynesboro. Along with groceries donated by our church members, the Team shops for groceries and delivers them monthly, the third Tuesday of each month. What wonderful relationships have developed due to this outreach ministry.

The A. C. T. Fund is a ministry where all monies donated are given to Waynesboro Community and Human Services and is designated for the Backpack Program. This provides a healthy food pack for children in the Waynesboro School District who do not have sufficient food at home over the weekend. This program

serves approximately 175 students each week. Caring for those less fortunate than others is part of our calling.

Weight Watchers continues to utilize our facility on Tuesday evenings and Wednesday mornings. I have enjoyed meeting many of the folks and am grateful we are a church willing to share our beautiful facility with outside groups. Other groups are Buchanan Trail Quilters, College Club, Life Line screening and the Hospital Auxiliary Greens sale. Sadly we are no longer being used by AL anon since the local chapter has dwindled to so few members and now attends a group in Gettysburg.

As in the past, Apostles is again involved in the ministry of the Fellowship of Churches in Waynesboro. This enables us to join with other UCC churches, denominations and ministries in our area to promote and offer special events that promotes and embraces diversity, fights for the powerless, reject racism and share the love of God. There were several worship experiences we were able to be a part of this year. In May I was able to participate in a National Day of Prayer service held in the new out-door area for Main Street Waynesboro. Also in May I participated in a Poverty Simulator held by Community and Human Services that was very eye opening and hopefully will be offered again in the near future. In October, along with members of our Community Outreach Team we were one of three churches who sponsored the Pet's and Blessings event at Red Run Park. We provided hotdogs, snacks and bottled water free to all who attended. We hope to participate again. The other October event was the CROP Walk now held on the Washington Township walking path. Shep and I were the only ones able to make it this year but we are hoping to grow that number next year and exceed the \$210.00 we raised. The other event I took part in was the Community Thanksgiving Service held at the ELC in Rouzerville. I continue to attend the bi-monthly meetings hosted by various churches represented. This is an area where three other members have given of their time to attend some of these meeting and help get other members at Apostles involved in opportunities for ministry.

Since coming to Apostles the week after Easter last April 2018, I have appreciated joining in on other opportunities for ministry and the many ways Apostles is living into the BE THE CHURCH message. I have made it my practice to be in the office on Wednesday mornings into the afternoon. There have been some weeks, due to holidays, vacations or doctor appointments that I have switched to another day of the week. We print the bulletin for the next Sunday Worship on Wednesdays most weeks. There were 29 Wednesdays and 6 other weekdays I had office hours.

APRIL: I led 3 Worship Services with one lifting up the theme for Earth Day. I attended Waynesboro Ministerium, Mercersburg Ministerium, and Social Seniors. I made 5 home visits with 3 receiving home communion. I made 2 nursing home visits.

MAY: I led 4 Worship Services with Communion on the first Sunday and honoring Mother's and women who have been like a mother to many for Mother's Day. I attended the Mercersburg Annual Meeting on May 6th, Consistory, Waynesboro Ministerium, Mercersburg Ministerium, Social Seniors at Apostles, a Poverty Simulator hosted by Community & Human Services, Silver Express, Fellowship of Churches meeting and gave the Invocation and Benediction at the Memorial Day Celebration and Service at Memorial Park. It was also a joy to help many of our folks with the preparing and planting of the amazing Monarch Waystation and doing outside work on the grounds of the church property. So glad we are embracing the gift of all the acreage around the church and trying to find ways to educate others and give them ways to care for the environment.

JUNE: I led Worship 3 Sundays with honoring our Graduate on June 3rd, Communion at our first Outdoor Worship Service for the summer on June 10th and honoring the Fathers and men in our lives on Father's Day, June 17th. On June 8-9 I attended Penn Central Conference Annual Meeting at Susquehanna University in Selinsgrove, PA. I took part in Silver Express on the 19th. From June 23 thru July 2nd I journeyed to Baton Rouge, Louisiana to join with folks from Trinity UCC, Waynesboro, to rebuild homes alongside Fuller Center.

JULY: I led 4 Worship Services with Communion on the 15th. Unfortunately we moved inside for worship that day due to rain. On June 8th I left for Hartman Center Church Camp to lead a 3-Day Getting Started Camp thru the 11th. I took part in Silver Express, The Monarch Program offered by our Outdoor Ministry Team, and Fellowship of Churches meeting. Since Consistory meets every-other-month I reported 5 home visits, 1 hospital visit and 1 nursing home visit.

AUGUST: I led 3 Worship Services, with the 19th having Outdoor Worship followed by our Church Picnic. All month Apostles collected School Supplies for Community and Human Services and it was truly amazing all the items we collected. Another way Apostles is caring for the poor, as the BE THE CHURCH message reminds us. I saw the Apostles community at their best as I did a Celebration of Life Service for Danny Deavers on August 26th. Your love and care for this Family's time of need was inspiring.

SEPTEMBER: I led 4 Worship Services. On the 2nd there was the Dedication of the Gardener's Shed in memory of Denny Bonner, during the worship time. On the 30th we held our first Healing Service since my coming to Apostles. I attended Waynesboro Ministerium, Mercersburg Ministerium, Social Seniors, and Silver Express. We joined with Trinity UCC to have a Free Outdoor Movie Night. The Consistory met in September, and several members and myself attended a Webinar given by the PA Academy of Ministry for three of the Conferences in PA. I did 6 home visits with 2 people receiving communion.

OCTOBER: I led 4 Worship Services with Communion on the first Sunday. I also dedicated all the items of clothing, sleep ware, health & beauty aids that many of you donated for the NGA's yearly collection. Our folks continue to give and share deeply of time, talent and resources. I took part in the Pet's & Blessings event at Red Run Park with many of our folks. Shep and I represented Apostles at the Waynesboro CROP Walk thanks to many of you sponsoring us with your monetary donations. I attended Mercersburg Ministerium, Social Seniors, Book Study, and Silver Express. Two other couples joined with myself as we enjoyed riding the Potomac Eagle Train Ride with Trinity UCC, Waynesboro.

NOVEMBER: I was able to take a vacation trip to Disney with our oldest son and his family that we had been planning for almost 2 years. I greatly appreciate your willingness to give me the time away with family. You also were willing to Worship with Trinity UCC, Waynesboro for their 200th Anniversary on November 18th when the speaker was our General Minister and President of the UCC, Rev. Dr. John Dorhauer. What a wonderful experience and chance for Apostles to look back at history when 62 people left Trinity UCC to form St. Paul's UCC on Potomac Street in Waynesboro. I led 1 Worship Service in November. I attended Book Study, Waynesboro Ministerium, Social Seniors, Mercersburg Ministerium, and a Fellowship of Churches meeting. I took part in the Community Thanksgiving Service and did a House Blessing for a family in the church. We did not have a Consistory meeting in November but I did 7 home visits with 2 communions, 1 hospital visit, and 1 nursing home visit.

DECEMBER: I led 5 Worship Services with Communion and Hanging of the Greens observed on the first Sunday. We continued decorating the church following a lite lunch after the worship service. What a joy to share my first Christmas Eve Candle Light/Communion Service with you all. I attended Waynesboro Ministerium and Social Seniors. On Sunday the 9th our Youth and many of our folks visited Sugar Hollow Alpaca Farm and learned about these beautiful creature. On Sunday the 16th a group of us enjoyed Christmas Caroling to 4 of our Shut-Ins. We all were enjoying this life! I also helped lead worship at Hearthstone Nursing Home here in Waynesboro, on three Sunday evenings this month. For December I had 2 home visits, 2 hospital visits and 2 nursing home visits.

Many of our Teams met this year following worship on Sundays and some during the week. I look forward to working with all the Teams in the new year as we continue to work to move Apostles forward. One last important effort was being part of the Team that worked to bring the Constitution and By Laws of Apostles up to date with the language we are now using for committees, which are now called Teams, and arranging the structure of the document so it would be easier for our folks to follow.

- April 1: Rev. Gloria McPherson, Mercersburg Association, lead the Easter Worship Service.

PROPERTY / OUTDOOR MINISTRY TEAM

The Team performed many tasks in 2018:

- Completed the annual maintenance service on the mower
- Prepared the stone base for the Dennis Bonner Memorial Shed
- Power washed and painted the mower shed to match the new shed
- Weeded, fluffed and added mulch to property beds & planted five planters
- Installed a new spigot with hose and nozzle on the south side of the building
- Organized a Pollinator & Wildlife Habitat group
- Became an official Monarch Butterfly Waystation with Monarchwatch.org
- Created a new 75-plant mulched nectar garden at the Habitat
- Hosted a community monarch butterfly program and distributed free caterpillar nurseries
- Rescued two groups of monarch caterpillars from the community
- Planted sunflowers in the Habitat to beautify the neighborhood, to feed the pollinators and wildlife, and to cut and give to church and community members
- Maintained a mowed walking path in the Habitat
- Watered beds and planters
- Trimmed dead and low-hanging branches from the trees on the property
- Purchased a larger tankless water heater to provide better hot water service
- Upgraded the narthex ceiling light units and one kitchen light unit to LED
- Monitored intermittent narthex roof leak and contacted roofing companies for a solution
- Arranged for Long's Tree Experts to donate their services to fell the blue spruce along Barnett Avenue for the Waynesboro Hospital Auxiliary to use for their Greens Sale, and to return to remove the trunk & limbs
- Completed the Fall outside property clean-up
- Contacted C-Ely Signs and Graphics of Waynesboro to make improvements to the moveable letter lawn sign
- Controlled inside ants with ant bait traps with first infestation, needed to have a treatment by Real Kill professional services after a more widespread second infestation
- Kept the lawn mowed and the snow plowed
