THOUGHTS FROM THE PASTOR.....

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind....You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

Matthew 22:37&39

Many times we find that during the summer months, things slow down for most of us, especially when it comes to what is happening at church. Here at Church of the Apostles that has not been the case. Most of the committees of the church (we are now calling Teams), have been meeting to discern how we can best utilize our resources here at Apostles and the ways God is calling us to minister to our fullest potential.

One "Team" that has been exploring new possibilities for ministry for Church of the Apostles is the Growth Team. Each of the Team members along with myself, have been praying and reading various books on church growth and vitality to assess a new approach to doing ministry in our church. One of the books is a guide developed for small churches within our denomination entitled "BE THE CHURCH". Because we have a common enemy, the pride and greed and fear that drive us apart and robs all of us of the richness of life God intends for us.

Share earthly and Spiritual resources

God blesses us so that we may be a blessing.

Embrace diversity

Because only together, in all our extravagant variation, do we fully reflect the glory of God.

Love God

You do understand, don't you, that loving God is not an obligation, but an extraordinary privilege?

Enjoy this life

Really? That's on the list? Yes, really! Enjoying this life is an important part of what it means to be the church.

So, the next step is to bring you, the members of Church of the Apostles, into the process by asking you to complete a preliminary assessment of our church's activities over the past five years. This will help us to identify where energies may exist that can be built upon within the congregation. These assessments are available now at the church office. August 9: Same Kind of Different as Me - A True Story

The book is available in the Narthex for anyone to read.

Successful businessman Ron Hall and his wife, Deborah, discover a renewed sense of purpose when they begin to volunteer at a local mission in Fort Worth, Texas. Their lives change forever when they develop an unlikely friendship with Denver Moore, a homeless man who inspires them to save their struggling marriage.

August 30: I Can Only Imagine - A True Story

Growing up in Greenville, Texas, Bart Millard suffers physical and emotional abuse at the hands of his father, Arthur. When Arthur becomes terminally ill, he finds redemption by embracing his faith and rediscovering his love for his son. Years later, Bart's troubled childhood and mended relationship with his dad inspires him to write the hit song "I Can Only Imagine" as singer of the Christian band MercyMe.

September 20: Paul, Apostle of Christ

Risking his life, Luke ventures to Rome to visit Paul - the apostle who's bound in chains and held captive in Nero's darkest and bleakest prison cell. Haunted by the shadows of his past misdeeds, Paul wonders if he's been forgotten as he awaits his grisly execution. Before Paul's death, Luke resolves to write another book that details the birth of what will come to be known as the church.

October 25: Risen

Roman military tribune Clavius (Joseph Fiennes) remains set in his ways after serving 25 years in the army. He arrives at a crossroad when he's tasked to investigate the mystery of what happened to Jesus (Cliff Curtis) following the Crucifixion. Accompanied by trusted aide Lucius (Tom Felton), his quest to disprove rumors of a risen Messiah makes him question his own beliefs and spirituality. As his journey takes him to places never dreamed of, Clavius discovers the truth that he's been seeking.

POLLINATOR & WILDLIFE HABITAT July 2018



Work is progressing on our Pollinator & Wildlife Habitat at the corner of Barnett Avenue and Amsterdam Road that is certified by MONARCH-WATCH.ORG as WAYSTATION #19178 in support of the conservation & preservation of the beloved, endangered Monarch butterfly and it's spectacular annual migration.

A Pollinator & Wildlife Habitat group has been formed to participate in Monarchwatch activities; and to further enhance, develop and maintain the Habitat. Church and community members of all ages who are interested in learning more about this group may contact Bob & Shelley Benchoff at 717-749-5202.

The milkweed and wildlife area has been enhanced with a new mulched cultivated nectar plants garden between the entrances to the mowed walking paths.



All of the sunflowers are planted and many are blooming! The Pollinator & Habitat Group members will host & cut sunflowers this month at the following times:

Tuesday, August 7th, 6:00-8:00 PM Friday, August 10th, 6:00-8:00 PM Monday, August 13th, 4:00-6:00 PM Monday, August 20th, 4:00-6:00 PM

Each family will be given 5 sunflowers and everyone is encouraged to take photos! For safety, all parking is in the church parking lot, access is by using the front sidewalk to the south end of the church and then across the lawn to the Habitat.

Come take a walk and enjoy this important environmental ministry as it grows into a site of natural beauty and provides a life-sustaining habitat for the pollinators and other wildlife.
