From the Pastors Study

As the days of one year ends and a new one begins many of us make promises to ourselves that we will change certain things about **our lives that we don't like.** Losing weight and eating healthier are often the most common promises we make. Some of us decide that we will save more money and spend less. Some of us promise to spend less time working and spend more time relaxing and enjoying life. But as we all know from our own experiences the changes we vow to make on New Year's Eve are not as easy to keep as we think they will be. That is because most of the negative things we want to change about ourselves have deep roots in our lives. Many of the things we do yet dislike serve a purpose in our life. They often fill an emotional emptiness we have within ourselves; they fill emptiness in our soul.

Over eating is often rooted in emotional issues that began in childhood thus the expression "emotional eating". What's eating you that makes you want to eat? Being a workaholic is often a compensation for feelings of inadequacy. We think our worth is in our work and how much we can accomplish. Our overspending temporarily fills an emptiness inside. It is a quick fix for feelings of not being loved. When we fill every minute of our lives with activities it is often because we are **running from ourselves**. We don't want to stop for a moment because then we might have to really be with ourselves, look at ourselves, and that makes us uncomfortable. We might not like what we see. All of these things distract us from living a full genuine life, the kind of life God intends for us.

Changes in our lives are much better made on a daily basis instead of on New Year's Eve. Every day can be a new beginning. Even better, every minute of the day can be a new beginning. Any time we are about to say or think something, or do something we have the opportunity to stop and evaluate what we are really saying, thinking or doing. What do those words really mean that are about to come out of our mouths? Are our thoughts at the moment based on truth or are they based on how we have thought about something our entire life without questioning their validity. Are the words we are about to speak for others to hear, based on what is true or are they more based on fear, anger, and ignorance (not knowing the truth about something.)? But more importantly are the words we speak and the thoughts we think based and grounded in God's love? If they are, then they will be based on truth.

God has always known from our beginning that we would need a lot of help getting through life. God has watched his people behave badly, make bad decisions, fight among themselves, go to war and persecute one another sometimes in the very name of God. God knew we needed a savior, someone to save us from ourselves, someone to be a genuine example of love for us to follow, to be a light in a dark world. And so after watching his people behave badly and in destructive ways for generation after generation, God decided now was the time and he sent us Jesus; The Way, The Truth, and The Life.

As we move forward into this new year consider doing so fully conscious of what you are thinking, saying, and doing. Ask yourself if your actions, your words, your thoughts are based in love. Stop allowing you emotions at a given moment to have power over your life. Be mindful that your words and actions have the power to lift someone up or to tear them down. God never wants us to tear one another down but to live in harmony with one another. God wants us to help one another along our journey together through life. None of us has all the answers or knows all the truth about anything. But God does. And it is through our relationship with God through Jesus, and by the power of the gift of the Holy Spirit, that we have what we need to live together in peace as the family of God.

God sent us Jesus that we might have new life, that we might have a brother to lean on and to go to when our lives are a mess. Someone who knows what it is like to live in this broken world with its many challenges. Be mindful of what Christmas is really about, God loving us so much that he was willing to come live among us as Jesus so that we would have hope for all eternity. What better gift could anyone ask for? How could we be anything but happy at such good news.






THE BELL I KNOW WHO I AM.
