

# PART-TIME PASTOR: How Does It Work?

Part-time Pastor Robert LaRoche of the Congregational Church of Union UCC in Connecticut has written a book about it entitled “Part-Time Pastor Full-Time Church”. Here are some excerpts from his book:

Available data shows that the majority of churches in this country are identified as small ones. Churches ought to be comfortable with their smallness and move beyond any inferiority complex about it. Some factors are beyond the control of churches in this regard: the changing place of religion in American life, demographic and population shifts, the advent and development of new religious movements, and many more. The simple reality is that most Americans are not in any church of any size on Sunday morning. Thus rather than bemoaning what it is not, the small church needs to cherish and affirm what it is in the current religious configuration of this nation – a magnificent gift !

Models for part-time pastors:

- #1. Pastor employed full-time elsewhere, part-time in the church.
- #2. Pastor employed primarily as a pastor with less than full-time salary and holding a part-time job as well.
- #3. Pastor serving half-time as a pastor and working in another job half-time as well.
- #4. Pastor serves as a part-time pastor at two or more churches. Another option would be a stand-alone part-time pastor position with no second job or the pastor is a student.

The author, Pastor LaRoche, is a Model #1. He is a full-time high school guidance counselor and married with three children while serving as a part-time (bivocational) pastor. Here is a “Sample Summary of Bivocational Ministry”:

“Ours is a very active church and I am very involved in leading and facilitating programs within it. I am not only accessible but also actively involved in the workings of the church on a day-to-day basis, even though I am not physically present through traditional office hours. In a typical week, I work between twenty-five and thirty hours in my capacity as pastor. In certain weeks, that goes up to close to forty. My congregation has not asked me to do time sheets or time cards. We make maximum use of Sunday mornings for meetings and educational programming. I am available for meetings by appointment based on mutual convenience and am responsive to requests for home and hospital visits. I communicate regularly through email updates. I also am in regular contact with our congregation leaders regarding committee work

and worship planning. Our website is highly utilized and a strong vehicle for communication. I have developed a blog for deeper exploration of issues discussed and preached about at worship. We have established communication channels for those in the congregation not engaged in internet use. I am very available for phone calls at home, and people affiliated with our congregation are given my cell phone number as well. I type the worship bulletin at home and it is emailed to one of our deacons by Wednesday of each week. We have no secretarial help. I spend extensive time at home in sermon preparation and in ongoing worship planning with our music director and the large number of people who share worship leadership. What you do not see in all of this is the traditional daytime office hours arrangement, but I think that I am highly accessible to my parishioners.”

# POLLINATOR'S HABITAT 2018

## SUNFLOWERS



This year we will invite the community onto the grounds for photos and sunflowers. Photography invitations will be advertised with parking in the parking lot and walking over to the field. Picking will be at advertised times with a church member(s) available to do the cutting with pruners/loppers from the inside rows along the wildflower area with the walking path providing access. There is a limit of five sunflowers per person/ family. Sunflowers will be free, as gifts to members and the community. At Ernie's suggestion there will be three plantings so the blooms will last longer.

The inner rows first, middle rows next and outer rows last for the best visibility from the roads.

## MILKWEED & WILDFLOWER AREA



A walking path with donated entrance & exit signs will again be kept mowed during the season. Donated nectar flowers will be planted in the habitat area between the walking path entrance & exit along the edge of the church lawn. Since we already meet the requirements, we will become an official MONARCH BUTTERFLY WAYSTATION certified by & registered with MONARCH WATCH as described at [www.MonarchWatch.org](http://www.MonarchWatch.org) located at 2701 Centerville Road, Wilmington, DE 19808 to show that we are supporting the conservation & preservation of this endangered & beloved

butterfly and it's spectacular annual migration. Interested church & community members are invited to become part of the Pollinator's Habitat & Monarch WayStation group to participate in the planting & maintenance of the nectar flower beds plus any additional Monarch Watch membership activities of interest such as monarch observation counts, record keeping & other educational experiences such as raising and if desired, tagging of monarchs before release. A church member is needed to lead this group( contact Bob Benchoff if you are interested) and conduct regular meetings for planning and activities. Julie Shindle, who gave a talk on Monarch Butterflies to our Social Seniors last year has already signed up to be a member of the group !




