THOUGHTS FROM THE PASTOR.....

"LENT" by Ann Weems

Lent is:

a time to take the time to let the power of our faith story take hold of us, a time to let the events get up and walk around us,

a time to intensify our living into Christ,

a time to hover over the thoughts of our hearts,

a time to place our feet in the streets of Jerusalem

or to walk along the sea and listen to his word,

a time to touch his robe and feel the healing surge through us,

a time to ponder and a time to wonder . . .

Lent is a time to allow a fresh new taste of God!

As your pastor and a companion on this journey of faith, I look forward to sharing in this season we call Lent. What is LENT? And why do we "Do Lent" every year? It's the 40-Day Period of repentance and renewal preceding Easter. Lent is a time that calls us to take an honest look at ourselves in terms of who we are, whose we are, and where we are on our journey of faith. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and ends with the Easter Service. The week leading up to Easter, Holy Week commemorates Christ's last week of life on earth. It's the final, most important part of Lent.

Traditionally we in the northern hemisphere have identified more closely with the meaning for "Lent" from the Middle English "Lente" which means "springtime." However, it may actually derive from the Latin word "Lentare" which means "to bend." As one of our UCC churches, Peace UCC in Shawano, WI describes, "This understanding reinforces a sense of Lent as a time of preparation and transformation. In Lent we allow ourselves to be 'bent straight' as we examine our lives and allow God's Spirit to bend us toward more Godly thoughts and actions."

With all this in mind, I am so pleased to share with you that here at Church of the Apostles UCC, we are offering a new opportunity to "bend" us toward a more meaningful journey through Lent this year. Starting on Sunday, March 10th, we invite all of our folks to set aside a half hour, beginning at 10am until 10:30am, to use a wonderful resource from the *"Stillspeaking Writers"* group

and the "Daily Devotional Contributors" in the United Church of Christ entitled "Take Nothing With You." Many of you used the "Come, Lord Jesus: 2018 Advent Devotional," which gave us an example similar to how the Lenten Devotional will be set up: with a biblical text, reflection, and prayer for each day from Ash Wednesday to Easter Sunday. The idea is to spend the half hour to discuss any of the devotionals that resonated with anyone in the group. As I found with the Advent Devotionals, there may be some that will challenge us to look at the topic in a different light, to stretch our faith and our understanding of our faith. But it promises to be a time of growth and a time of sharing and dialoguing with each other in an open and safe environment.

These *Stillspeaking Writers* offer this resource with the thought: "when we enter the spiritual journey of Lent, we often take things with us: our past experiences, our interpretations of Scripture, our questions about the world, our struggles in faith." They ask us to consider, "what does an unencumbered journey look like?" My hope is that you will be willing to find out with all those who desire to join together for this year's Lenten journey.
