I want to thank the 50th Anniversary Team that met together monthly for almost a year and through prayer, planning and purposeful-dedication have made it possible for this significant celebration in the life of our Church. These folks are: Bob Benchoff, Judy Fitz, Richard Hovis, Mary Lou Misner, along with me. Linda Ritchey as Archive Team Chair, will have on display historical memorabilia leading up to the present. My heart-felt thanks to these folks for their amazing efforts.

Here is a synopsis of what we will experience on June 8th and 9th: Beginning at 5pm on Saturday, June 8th, we will gather together to share a meal catered by Keystone Family Restaurant. Following the meal all attending will be able to "take a walk back in history" and enjoy memorabilia from the merger here at Apostles, taking us thru the years until the present. All this is made possible by Linda Ritchey. Thanks to Linda for all the time spent preparing this wonderful presentation. At 7pm will be a concert by Sweet Life Music, a husband and wife duo that perform various "genres" of music to "bring you closer to the important people in your world." The concert is in loving memory of Audrey Eshelman by her family. We are grateful to the family for underwriting the concert.

Sunday, June 9th will be our service of Worship and Celebration at 10am. We are looking forward to renewing old friendships as an Alumni Choir has been formed to bring us special music during the service. All past clergy were extended invitations to join us, but do to other commitments; most will be unable to join us. Rev. Bill Swisher and his wife, Annabelle will be coming back and Rev. Swisher will share some memories with our children and youth during the service. Our keynote speaker for the service will be the Rev. Beth Firme, a past member here at Apostles, who began her ministry as a licensed pastor and recently received her ordained status through York Association of the Penn Central Conference. We are looking forward to the message Beth will share with us. During the worship time we will dedicate new, inside doors installed in memory of Donald McCleaf who was the Assistant Chair of the Building Committee here at Apostles. Following the meal will be an inspiring concert by the duo "Sweet Life Music"!




The new double doors in the Narthex



POLLINATOR & WILDLIFE HABITAT JUNE 2019

We joyously gave 140 young milkweed plants and several fennel plants from our nectar garden to 11 interested church and community members in May so they could establish more butterfly gardens. Two of the recipients represented groups that plan to become official Monarch Waystations. Some of the individuals are also planning to register their home gardens as Monarch Waystations.

Fennel along with parsley, dill, carrots, rue and Queen Anne's Lace are the host plants for the beautiful Black Swallowtail butterfly, which will also be featured at JULIE SHINDLE'S BUTTER-FLY PROGRAM TO BE HELD IN THE SOCIAL HALL ON THURSDAY, AUGUST 8TH AT 6:00 PM. This year Julie will again teach all about the Monarch and Black Swallowtail butterflies, how to help them, and how to raise the caterpillars to adults and release them.





Our Pollinator & Wildlife Group will again provide nurseries for families to use in raising Monarch caterpillars. If you are interested in a nursery for your family, please contact Shelley & Bob Benchoff at 717-749-5202 or benchoff360@comcast.net by August 1st.

Come take a walk across the church yard to enjoy the beauty of the nectar garden and butterfly waystation and see how many

pollinators and other wildlife you may see. Once there, take a stroll on the mowed walking paths to explore the entire habitat.

As summer arrives keep an eye out for this year's new growth of sunflowers as they once again begin preparing for their spectacular bloom!




