#### THOUGHTS FROM THE PASTOR ...

"When the angels went away from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has made known to us." Luke 2:15

A new Church year has begun. This means the season of Advent has arrived. Advent is a season of expectant waiting and preparation for both the celebration of the birth of Jesus and the anticipation of the return of Jesus at the time of the Second Coming. The word *advent* is adopted from the Latin *adventus* and means "coming" or "arrival." In Western Christianity, Advent begins on the Sunday closest to November 30<sup>th</sup> (St. Andrew's Day) and lasts through Christmas Eve, or December 24<sup>th</sup>.

Advent is a period of Spiritual preparation in which many Christians make ourselves ready for the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ. Celebrating Advent typically involves a season of prayer, fasting, repentance, followed by anticipation, hope, and joy. Many Christians celebrate Advent not only by thanking God for sending Christ Jesus to earth as a baby, but also, for his presence among us today through the Holy Spirit and in preparation and anticipation of his final coming at the end of the age.

In her book *"Kneeling in Bethlehem,"* Ann Weems has penned a wonderful writing entitled *In search of our kneeling places*. Let me share it with you:

In each heart lies a Bethlehem An inn where we must ultimately answer Whether there is room or not When we are Bethlehem-bound We experience our own advent in his When we are Bethlehem-bound We can no longer look the other way conveniently not seeing stars Not hearing angel voices. We can no longer excuse ourselves by busily Tending our sheep or our kingdoms. This Advent let's go to Bethlehem And see this thing that the Lord has made known to us In the midst of shopping sprees Let's ponder in our hearts the Gift of Gifts. Through the tinsel Let's look for the gold of the Christmas Star. In the excitement and confusion, in the merry chaos, Let's listen for the brush of angels' wings.

#### This Advent, let's go to Bethlehem And find our kneeling places.

This Advent season, my hope is that you will join me as we are "Bethlehembound." Just as the shepherds left their flocks to seek out the newborn baby, I invite you to leave behind all that would keep you from experiencing anew the good news of the gospels: the birth, life, ministry, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. Let us take time to find our "kneeling places" and worship the new born king!

#### A Message from our Consistory President

# Suspension of indoor, in-person worship.

Governor Wolf has issued a stayat-home advisory that lasts until January 4, 2021. It's essentially the same as the stay-at-home order he issued in April, except it says "I'm advising you to stay home," instead of "I'm ordering you to stay home." What's the practical difference between the two? For us, there is no difference. Religious institutions were exempt from the Governor's order in April, but the Governor asked religious leaders to voluntarily curtail in-person gatherings to limit the spread of the virus, and curtail we did. We're being asked to do the same now, and I believe we should respond in the same way. If anything, the COVID situation is even more serious now than it was eight months ago. I met with Pastor Narda to discuss this matter on November 24<sup>th</sup>, and we agreed that we should worship virtually until the Governor's order expires.

Consistory concurred with the decision to suspend indoor, in-person worship, but they really struggled with it. I can certainly understand the frustration and the feelings of sadness and disappointment that accompany a decision like this. It seems unfair that we should give up in-person worship while others are going to the grocery store, eating out in restaurants, and doing other things that seem to embody more risk than indoor

worship. Unfortunately, we can't control what other people do. We're only responsible for ourselves. We have an alternative to in-person worship that will keep us and people we come in contact with safe, so we decided we should use it.

#### **Celebrating Advent and Christmas virtually.**

I'm afraid this isn't going to be a normal Advent and Christmas season, but we have some ideas to enhance virtual worship in honor of the season. Here are a few:

We will have guest presenters for "The Child in All of Us" segment during Advent. Presentations will follow the traditional Advent themes of Hope (Laurie Hovermale, 11/29), Peace (Bob Benchoff, 12/6), Joy (Bert Hovermale, 12/13), and Love (Mary Lou Misner, 12/20).

In addition to solo pieces by our organist, Jim Heefner, we can look forward to a Christmas Cantata by the Penn Central Conference Virtual Choir. The cantata has been produced in such a way that we can share songs individually or as a complete program.

We plan to produce a special program for Christmas Eve featuring recorded performances from guest artists. We'll use these videos together with readings, a Christmas message, and prayers to construct a nice Christmas Eve worship experience that I think you will enjoy.

The last time we suspended in-person worship we reached out to members by publishing daily email inspirational messages. We called this experiment "Bridging the Social Distance." Instead of doing that again, Pastor Narda had an idea to have a midweek Zoom discussion with anyone who wanted to join. There will be a theme and a facilitator for each session. We are thinking of making this connection on Wednesday evenings. Please let Pastor Narda know if you are interested.

Don't forget to pick up your Apostles Advent Devotional Guide. The daily messages were written by some of the same folks who contributed to "Bridging the Social Distance." The theme of the guide is "Finding Peace in the Chaos." I think we were right on target with that one! I hope the devotions help you "find the good" this Advent season. May God heal our 2020 scars and grant us peace in the new year. Amen.

ach year, the Pension Boards receives many notes and letters of thanks

It was depleted to 10% of capacity, and we have been having some very cold nights this winter. My husband's illness has precluded him from doing any work for the last 6 months, and we have fallen way behind in our living expenses...

"My church, although solvent, was unable to give me a raise this year and is experiencing a shortfall in pledges. Thank you again for your faithful and compassionate gift which has enabled us to keep warm!"

"This note is a heartfelt thank you for the very generous emergency grant that the Board provided us to help offset costs associated with my kidney transplant and follow-up medical procedures and appointments. Not surprisingly, our family prayed a lot in the months leading up to my transplant in great anticipation of what was coming, and in the time since, having received the gift of a ' second chance' at life...

"We are grateful for modem medicine, excellent medical providers, and the support of our local and wider church families and friends, including the United Church of Christ Pension Boards...

"We never lost faith, trusting in Christ's promise that we would not - and will not have to walk alone. Thank you for meeting us along our path and for extending your outstretched hand to help us financially."


#### In 2019, gifts to the Christmas Fund enabled:

Success Story

One of our recently discharged youth lived with us for almost a year. The child was diagnosed with PTSD and had a history of severe physical and sexual abuse. This youth came to us with no where to go after treatment and was overcome with frustration towards the idea of being in a residential treatment program. The child struggled to create and maintain healthy relationships, as well as work towards therapy goals. After being introduced to a family who had a heightened interest in welcoming the child into their home, this child became much

more engaged and involved in treatment. The child participated in family sessions and visits with the potential adoptive family. The kindness this family had shown in supporting the youth through treatment was a key turning point. Through the constant support of staff, therapists, and the treatment team, the child made significant progress. The child showed exponential growth, not only in their behaviors,

but as a role model for peers in the residence. The child eventually completed their treatment and was placed in the care of the adoptive family. To witness this child create healthy relationships and be united with a supportive family was phenomenal. This child continues to progress, excel, and work towards future goals, all while having a supportive adoptive family to be by their side along the way.
