

THOUGHTS FROM THE PASTOR....

"If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me." Matthew 16:24

The month of February has several holidays like Ground Hogs Day where we find out if winter is coming to a quick end or going to stick around a bit longer. We have Valentine's Day which has roots inside and outside the church and then a few days after, we have President's Day. But it is Lent that sometimes, due to the phases of the moon, rounds out the significant holidays in February.

This year the season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 26 and ends on Holy Saturday, April 11th. The season of Lent encourages us to practice spiritual disciplines and make them a part of our daily faith life. Spiritual disciplines include such practices as prayer, meditation, reading scripture, fasting, looking beyond ourselves to serve others, and participation in church worship services. The goal of these practices is spiritual growth. As we grow spiritually, we focus more fully on our relationship with God and Jesus Christ.



During this season of Lent our congregation here at Apostles will share in a special Lenten Worship series entitled "By My Hand ... For My Sake." The series offers us a question to ponder: What is your role in the suffering and death of Christ? For the six weeks of Lent, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter we will address this question through homilies, monologs by biblical characters who actually did have a hand in the crucifixion of Christ.

Characters include: Eve, Nicodemus, Judas, Barabbas, Pilate, and the Mother of the Thief on the right of Jesus on the day of crucifixion, Peter, the Centurion, and Mary Magdalene. This is an opportunity for many of you to portray one of these biblical characters and bring them to life right before our eyes here during our worship services at Apostles as we journey through the Lenten season.

I look forward to this important season in the life of the church.



APOSTLES CONSISTORY FOR 2020

Bert Hovermale, Consistory President

The Church of the Apostles 2020 Consistory had its formational meeting on January 19, 2020. It's my privilege to be Consistory President for 2020. Chris Bobb is our Vice-President, and Laurie Hovermale is our Recording Secretary. The other members of this year's Consistory are Elders Judy Fitz, Torri VanReenen and Richard Hovis, and Deacons Larry Little and Joanne Keech. Pastor Narda and Church Secretary/Treasurer Linda Richey fill vital roles as ex-officio members. We recognize the debt we owe the Consistory members whose term has just ended. I have a particularly daunting task trying to fill the shoes of outgoing President Mary Lou Misner. Mary Lou and her colleagues worked very hard to put the Church on a good financial footing, and our 2020 Consistory will continue those practices that delivered the first positive budget the Church has had in years.

We are in the process of solidifying team rosters for 2020. It's important that our teams have good leadership and the members they need to accomplish their missions. The Christian Outreach (Judy Fitz is the lead), Lay Life and Work (the lead is Laurie Hovermale), and Worship (Bert Hovermale is the lead) Teams are active and doing good things, but they can use more willing workers.

Richard Hovis and Bruce Barr have been Property Team mainstays, and we're thankful for the additional help Chris Bobb and Larry Little will provide. The Property Team primarily gets things done by determining an approach to an issue, then finding and overseeing a contractor who will take care of it at a reasonable cost. Our Property Team to-do list includes addressing some persistent issues, namely fixing our leaky roof, getting hot water to the kitchen, and making the ladies rest room more handicap accessible. The Property Team is always busy, and they could use your help if you have the interest and some time.

The Christian Education Team needs a leader and new members. Christian Education is much more than just Sunday School for children, but developing new programming for children and youth is an important objective of ours this year. If we wait until we have more children in church to start developing programming it will be much too late. We could really use some volunteers who want to follow Jesus by following his example of loving and serving children.

I hope you will help us "Be The Church" by volunteering to serve on one or more of these teams. If you want to help, but none of the teams mentioned above piqued your interest, I may have a special job for you. The UCC is encouraging all of its member churches to develop emergency response plans. Natural disasters, fires, medical emergencies, and active shooter situations all qualify as emergencies. Some churches call these "Safety Plans" and have "Safety Teams" established to respond to an emergency. The UCC has training materials and templates to help congregations carry out this important responsibility. I'd like to put together an ad hoc team comprised of three to five people to tackle this. Please let me know if you are interested.

FEBRUARY IS BLANKET MONTH

Church World Service always designates Valentine's Day as Blanket Sunday. We are designating **FEBRUARY** as **BLANKET MONTH**. Some years ago we participated in this Outreach and thought we would participate again. During the month of February a blanket will



be hung in the front of the Church (one of Sondra's originals) and you can pin money to the blanket during the month. Then a check will be sent to Church World Service the first of March.



This money will be used to give blankets to homeless people including veterans and people who have lost everything in disasters. Sleeping on hard surfaces like concrete is well.....hard...and in the winter when those surfaces become ice-cold....sleeping is impossible. These blankets provide warmth and a healing embrace from someone who cares. That Christ's love comforts and heals. Pray for those who need a blanket to stay warm this winter.

PLANS TO DELIVER CWS CLEAN-UP BUCKETS


Plans have been finalized to deliver the 15 Church World Service Clean-up Buckets that Apostles put together in response to notification of the need for buckets in response to the recent disasters in the United States and around the world.

The Brethren Service Center in New Windsor, MD, has been heling people in need for over 65 years. Owned and operated by the Church of the Brethren, it houses organizations that work in areas of relief and development, disaster response, social justice, peace education and hospitality, including Brethren Disaster Ministries, Material Resources, SERRV and Earth Peace.

The Brethren Service Center accepts School Kits, Hygiene Kits and Emergency Clean-up Bucket Kits year round on behalf of Church World Service, where they're stored until disaster strikes. Then, they're shipped from New Windsor to disaster sites in the United States and around the world.



Details for trip to deliver buckets are: Meet at Church of the Apostles between 8:45 - 9am on Monday, February 17th. Leave church by 9am and arrive at Brethren Service Center by 10:30am. Drop off 15 buckets and tour warehouse at service center. Everyone is invited to join us for the trip. We plan to return to Waynesboro by 1:00pm, unless the group decides to stop for lunch. See the sign-up sheet at church or let Pastor Narda know if you plan to make the trip.
