#### THOUGHTS FROM THE PASTOR .....

As we change the calendar to January we often think another Christmas is over and we can take down the Christmas decorations and begin thinking about the New Year. We seem to be in a hurry to put Christmas in a box and pack it away. We seem to be in a rush for the next holiday. Before you do, take time to read this writing by Ann Weems:

#### BOXED

I must admit to a certain quilt about stuffing the Holly Family into a box in the aftermath of Christmas. It's frankly a time of personal triumph when each Advent's eve. I free them (and others), from a year's imprisonment boxed in the dark of our basement. Out they come, one by one, struggling through the straw, last year's tinsel still clinging to their roves. Nevertheless, they appear, ready to take their place again, in the light of another Christmas. The Child is first because he's the one I'm most reluctant to box. Attached forever to his cradle, he emerges, apparently unscathed from the time spent upside down, to avoid the crush of the lid. His mother, dressed eternally in blue, still gazes adoringly, in spite of the fact that her features are somewhat smudged. Joseph has stood for eleven months, holding valiantly what's left of his staff, broken twenty Christmases ago by a child who hugged a little too tightly. The Wise Ones still travel, though not quite so elegantly. the standing camel having lost its back leg and the sitting camel having lost one ear. However, gifts intact, they are ready to move. sometimes confused with Joseph (who wears the same dull brown). tumble forth, followed by three sheep in very bad repair. There they are again, not a grand set surely. but one of the children (and now the grandchildren) can touch and move about to reenact the silent night. When the others return, we will wind the music box on the back of the stable and light the Advent candles and go once again to Bethlehem. And this year, when it's time to pack the figures away, we'll be more careful that the Peace and Goodwill are not boxed for another year!

Hopefully we will re-discover and share the peace and goodwill that we find during the Advent and Christmas season and realize that the work of Christmas is just beginning.


\$350 was donated to Habitat for Humanity in 2020 including \$104 from Garden Produce! Habitat

#### CONGREGATIONAL EMPOWERMENT PROGRAM

Once again Penn Central Conference is supporting its churches by offering another program that will be very helpful during these days of dealing with the COVID-19 pandemic. So many clergy, myself included, have been wondering what more we can do to help us DO and BE Church during these difficult days. Thanks to the Rev. Dr. Marisa Laviola, Associate Conference Minister for Congregational Transitions, the conference is offering our churches a new program: Congregational Empowerment Team Inaugural Academy for PCC Congregations. This initiative is intended to provide support the churches through a team of clergy and layperson volunteers trained in a coaching approach to congregational leadership. The coaches seek to empower congregations to find new ways to share their faith, guide them in discernment of their God-inspired mission, and build their capacity to move toward realizing their vision of how to be Christ's church in the 21st century.

Each Church participating will be assigned a coach to help clarify issues/ concerns, brainstorm possible responses, determine a course of action, and then support that church as they move toward accomplishing their goals. Along with other teams and coaches we will participate in 3 virtual workshops led by Rev. Paul Nickerson of Nickerson Consulting. Rev. Nickerson is no stranger to Penn Central Conference as he has been involved in other revitalization programs offered to our churches. Workshops are scheduled for Saturday, January 23 or Sunday, January 24; Saturday, March 13 or Sunday March 14; and Saturday, May 15 or Sunday, May 16, 2021. Due to a grant to fund this program, the \$650.00 fee will be covered and there will be no cost to any of the churches in the conference. The only requirement for each church is several Lay persons and the Pastor to commit to the program. I am so pleased and grateful to Bob Benchoff and Bert Hovermale for volunteering to commit to this important and vital program for our church as we move forward and contemplate what the church will look like post-pandemic.

We will keep you posted on the possibilities and progress of the Congregational Empowerment Team. All we ask of each of you is an openness to join with us as we implement ideas and most importantly your prayers to help us discern God's will for Apostles UCC.


